

It was the summer of 1995, and Denise Scotti was a new graduate of Cornell University, living in her hometown of Long Island, NY. She and a friend were at a local sports bar to celebrate a hometown reunion when a handsome young man by the name of Kevin Smith caught Denise's eye. Denise caught Kevin's eye as well, but it was her jukebox selection that really piqued his interest. The pair struck up a conversation that went past their mutual appreciation of The Grateful Dead and went on into the night. As much as they enjoyed each other's company, at the end of the night, they didn't make plans to meet again. She pointed Kevin out to her friends, saying, "See that guy? I could see myself marrying him—and I'm not even the type that wants to get married!" "That guy" approached Denise, and reminded her of the night they met earlier in the summer. The two began dating, and in August 2000, Denise Scotti became Denise Scotti-Smith.

interests, such as an appreciation for a wide variety of music, spending time with friends and family, and deep-sea fishing. They also share an affinity for serving others. Denise maintains a high level of volunteer involvement in our community. She serves on the Board of Directors for the Simpsonville Chamber of Commerce and also regularly gives her time to Junior Achievement, teaching students of all ages skills needed for success in the workplace. She was an avid volunteer for several organizations during her time in college. On her first date with Kevin, and many subsequent ones, she brought along one of the adults that she cared for in a residential facility. Denise explains, "If he (Kevin) couldn't appreciate all dimensions of my core and what makes me who I am, as I do him, we would not be where we are today!" She goes on to say, "We share a love of tending to causes greater than ourselves and Kevin's commitment to do so is what I love most about him." Kevin and Denise always bonded through their mutual devotion to civic activities, and they have been known to frequently recruit friends and family to join them in their pursuits. While serving on the board of an organization dedicated to community development and quality of life issues, Denise and Kevin were able to convince their friends and family to join them at an annual fundraiser, serving tea and dressed in colonial attire at a historic estate. "They were reluctant at first," Denise admits, "but we always made great memories. It felt good, knowing we were raising money to invest back into our historic community."

Denise continues. "A great cause tends to attract positive people who inspire our children and serve as additional



role models. We want our children to know that they can do anything they put their mind to and that they have the power to inspire others to do the same!"

Denise and Kevin also share a strong entrepreneurial spirit. Denise started her business, Mission Accomplished Consulting in 2008. She is the owner and president of the company, which provides human resource management services to all industries. Denise believes she inherited her entrepreneurial streak from her mother, who has a similar drive. "I'm often accused of working too much, but I love what I do, so it doesn't always feel like work to me! I'm always thinking of ways to improve my own business or my clients' businesses. The ideas don't stop coming just because office hours are over. Free time, work time, volunteer time, they all overlap; but, I really do love it that way."

Kevin credits his dad for his entrepreneurial tendencies. When he was just a teenager, Kevin began working with his dad, installing cabinets. Later, the pair went into business together and started Wellcraft Installation in 1995. Over time, Kevin's attention to detail, customer service, and quality earned him a solid reputation in the field of custom, high-end cabinetry. In 2010, Kevin and his partners founded Packard Cabinetry in downtown Hendersonville, NC. Kevin's work has been featured in several magazines, including House, Traditional Home, Better Homes & Gardens, and Carolina Home & Garden.

In his spare time, Kevin enjoys making home-brewed craft beer. He likes coming up with his own all-grain recipes. Denise says it's not unusual for him to convert the kitchen into "something that looks like a science lab!" He is a member

of South Carolina Upstate Brewers Anonymous (SCUBA) and recently won a contest for his home brew. He's hoping to bring home more wins.

Denise and Kevin definitely make family time a priority. They have two sons, Kevin, Jr. (15) and Vincent ("Vinny," 12). The boys inherited Denise and Kevin's love for deep-sea fishing and crabbing, just as Denise and Kevin did back on Long Island. Denise tells me, "Since we moved to Greenville, we take the opportunity to get the kids out to the coast when we can. Our trips to Long Island wouldn't be complete without grabbing some chicken on some string to get some blue claw crabs!"

Between running two businesses, doing schoolwork, and fitting in extracurricular activities, finding free time to get away with the family can be a challenge. So, the Smiths make the most of their daily routine by cooking together in the kitchen. They share stories and traditional recipes passed down for generations, including homemade raviolis, Italian Rainbow cookies, and many others. "We all love experimenting with unique ingredients and recipes," Denise says. "Sharing old traditions and creating new ones is a legacy we want to leave with our children to pass down for generations to come. We are a family of 'foodies.' Our kids will eat just about anything, which allows us to have a lot of adventures around food."

In addition to putting his creativity to work in the kitchen, Kevin, Jr. also has aspirations of becoming a developer in the gaming industry one day. To achieve this goal, his course work at Mauldin High School is heavy in computer sciences. A well-rounded student, Kevin, Jr. also enjoys playing viola with his friends in the MHS orchestra. During his summer break, he occasionally works with his dad, learning the carpentry trade and business. He has practiced mixed martial arts since he was in kindergarten and is working toward his third degree black belt from Hurricane Karate. His dedication to the martial arts is an inspiration to his dad. So much so that Kevin, Sr. is currently working towards his first degree black belt.

Vinny may have gotten the entrepreneur bug from his parents. He recently decided to start his own lawn care and pet care service, and already has several consistent customers! The volunteer bug is there, too. He served as president of the student council at Rudolph Gordon Middle School last year. He also loves playing baseball and riding his skateboard. If he isn't playing Fortnite, you can find him running around the neighborhood, playing with his friends.






were raised. They don't have many relatives in Greenville, but they're incredibly grateful for the neighborhood friends that have become their family.

# The Plumber's Superpower

Getting a trained technician's eyes on a situation promises an accurate diagnosis.

When you call a plumber for a clogged drain, at that moment, you only care about

the symptom. You want the clog gone! You might not be thinking about what caused the backup.

A good plumber asks this question to help you avoid recurring issues. What caused the clog?

Say you went to the doctor with a pain in your leg. Imagine if they wrote you a prescription for pain pills without ever doing an x-ray.

Now, that doctor would lose her license pretty fast. But it happens all the time in plumbing, where you get a sewer line cleared with no diagnostic inspection performed.

The plumber collects their few hundred bucks and wishes you good luck. Maybe he throws in a lecture on not flushing your floss for good measure.

Those days should be long gone.

For the most part, plumbers use the same drain cleaning tools invented in the 1920s. This cable machine or 'rooter' works well for punching holes through clogs. But it only provides a few vague clues about underlying problems.

Back then, sewer line problems were diagnosed based on a 'feeling.' Not like a sixth sense type feeling, but a hitch in the machine. It took years for a plumber to become confident enough to diagnose a broken sewer line.

If you were lucky, you'd have a few stray roots stuck at the end of the device. That's evidence of a root intrusion, but you had no way of knowing how serious the issue was without digging.

Sewer cameras allow our plumbers to see underground - literally. It's always lovely when technology gives you superpowers!

Your focus might be the 'pain' - the clog, but don't ignore the cause. You might have a break in your line, root intrusion, or any number of issues.

Or maybe not.

Sometimes clogs are caused by years of buildup. A good hydro jet cleaning can scrub away years of accumulation in about an hour. But without diagnostic tools like camera inspections, there is no way for a plumber to know the culprit.

Cameras allow us to get eyes on the situation. It turns out that a picture is worth thousands of dollars in excavation fees.

We can't create a treatment plan without a full diagnosis. The sewer camera gives us the whole picture - pun intended.

You can decide on a long-term or permanent solution with full confidence. No more late-night visits from the plumber!





No wait-and-see worrying. No unnecessary digging up your garden. Camera technology is a lot newer than those rooter machines that came in fashion along with flapper dresses. But it has quickly become equally crucial in the plumber's tool arsenal.

She formed this organization to raise funds to benefit the Canine F.E.T.C.H. (Friends Encouraging Therapeutic Coping and Healing) Unit at Prisma Health–Upstate. The F.E.T.C.H. Unit is an animal-assisted therapy program for patients and their families. The program provides facility dogs who partner with a handler to care for patients at the hospital. Facility dogs differ from therapy dogs in that they are expertly trained from birth to work full-time with a handler and be actively involved in patient care. In a health care environment, activities such as grooming, feeding, snuggling, and playing fetch with a facility dog can aid patients in medical rehabilitation and psychiatric programs. The F.E.T.C.H. unit currently employs six dogs. The dogs are expected to work 7-10 years.

When McCain was in the 5th grade, she was inspired to philanthropy work by one of her teachers. Mrs. Katie Trapani from Cornerstone Christian Academy in Norcross, Georgia gave each of the students in her class \$5. She told the students they could choose to donate the money directly to a cause of their choice; or, they could use the money to try and raise funds for their cause. McCain took her \$5





and bought popsicles. She sold the popsicles and raised \$1,000, which she then donated to the Georgia SPCA.

Shortly after the Childress family moved to our area, McCain learned about the Canine F.E.T.C.H. unit. She recognized that the organization was a perfect fit for her desire to help animals and a continuation of the work she started while living in Georgia. Sadly, Katie Trapani, the teacher that was such an inspiration to McCain and her classmates, passed away from breast cancer in 2017. # What happens if your car is totaled?

If your car has been damaged and the potential repair costs exceed the value of the car, it is considered a total loss. Here are answers to common questions that spring up when your vehicle has been declared totaled.

#### Why was my vehicle totaled?

the deductible you chose when insuring it, as well as any applicable state taxes and/or fees.

#### What if I'm still paying off the vehicle?

You'll be responsible for satisfying your loan agreement whether or not the money you receive covers it all. This is why you might consider gap insurance, so called because it covers the gap between what you owe on the vehicle and its current market value. 

## **Improve Your Posture with 4 Easy Exercises**

It doesn't matter how attractive you are; if you walk into a room with a flexed and slumped posture, you

will not be looking very good! Not to mention, you will likely have back pain! Poor posture leads to stressed muscles and ligaments. As a result, poor posture can easily lead to back pain. In contrast, tall, straight posture and a strong core can make a person appear confident, strong, and young, as well as reduce back pain.

Many older adults struggle with poor posture and often assume that rounded shoulders and a flexed spine are part of the normal aging process. This is absolutely untrue! Poor posture comes from weak and tight muscles that occur as a result of sitting in flexed positions for long periods of time.

Thankfully, there are a few simple exercises that, when performed regularly, can keep you standing straight and tall!

1. Standing backward bend: Stand with feet shoulder-width apart. Place your hands on the back of your hips, and slowly lean back, arching your back and bringing the hips forward. Hold for 15-30 secs. Repeat 3-4 times a day.

- 2. Scapular retraction: Hold onto weights with arms by your side. Squeeze your shoulder blades back together. Hold for 15 secs. Repeat 15 times.
- **3. Chair sit-up:** Sit on the edge of a chair. Keeping the back straight, lean back at the same time you are extending your legs, then return to the sitting position. Repeat ten times.
- **4. Doorway pectoral stretch:** Stand in a door frame. Place your hands high on the door frame and lean in. You should feel a good stretch in the front of your shoulders and your pectoral muscles. Hold for 30 secs. Repeat twice a day.

Poor posture is not part of normal aging and can be prevented! Performed daily, these simple exercises can have a profound impact on improving the way you stand and feel.


# **Love Is Blind**




